Key Stage One:

Spoken Language

Literacy:

- Acquire a wide vocabulary
- Gain and maintain interest of listeners
- Sequence of events and how information is related
- Become competent in the arts of speaking and listening, making formal presentations, demonstrating to others

Science:

- Identifying and classifying
- Identify and name common and wild plants
- identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
- Identify that most living things live in habitats that are suited to them
- Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats
- Describe how animals obtain food and water
- Describe how plants need water, light and temperature
- Notice that animals have offspring that grow into adults
- Describe the basic needs of animals
- Observe and discuss changes across the four seasons and the weather associated with the seasons.

Geography:

- identify seasonal and daily weather patterns and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles.

Music

- Use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes



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Key Stage Two:

Literacy:

- Drawing inferences – characters feelings, thoughts and motives
- Identifying how language, structure and presentation convey meaning

Science:

- Explore the requirements of plants for life and growth
- Identify that animals need the right type of nutrition
- Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose a danger to living things.
- Recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light.
- Notice that light is reflected from surfaces.
- Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled.
- Identify common appliances that run on electricity.
- Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways

Geography:

- Describe and understand key aspects of physical geography including climate zones and rivers
- Describe and understand key aspects of human geography including types of settlement and land use

Music:

- Perform in solo and ensemble contexts; using their voices with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression
